Scope of Work

Guiding Mosaic 2010 (GM2010) is Girl Guides of Canada's next national camp, and will be held July 8 – 17, 2010 at Guelph Lake Conservation Area in Southern Ontario.

The overall camp goals are as follows:

- To provide a camp that incorporates girl voice in planning and implementation
- To provide a camp that provides Rangers with leadership opportunities
- To provide a camp experience that retains Members and recruits new Members
- To provide a camp that provides equitable access for all applicants
- To provide a camp that creates media awareness of Girl Guides of Canada
- To provide a camp that is program based, not camping skills based

The National Camp Steering Committee has deemed the following overarching guidelines for GM2010:

- GM2010 will provide girls with the opportunity to participate in the planning and implementation of all aspects of this camp
- GM2010 will have an environmental consciousness and "go green" focus to all activities and services provided to participants.
- GM2010 will have an historical touch in activities for participants

Volunteer Opportunity – Waterfront Team Member - Watcher

This position works with and supports the Waterfront Section Lead, the Camp Experience Team and the Events Department (GGC) and together the team will work in a collaborative effort to ensure the delivery of camp is an efficient one. This position will be accountable to the Waterfront Section Leader.

Key Responsibilities

As a member of the Waterfront Team for the GM2010 Camp Experience Team, you and the team will be responsible for the safety of all camp participants during water activity options delivered at camp.

As a Watcher for the GM2010 Waterfront Team your key responsibilities will include the following:

- Watch swimmers, from the pool deck or the shore and do not swim while performing their duties.

- Assist aquatic personnel in managing an incident as directed
 - General supervision of the location and behaviour of swimmers who are not in the water and must not be in a pool viewing area or occupied doing anything else.
 - Work with your team members of Lifeguards and Lifesavers to ensure a cohesive plan for control of the waterfront for participants

Qualifications

You must be at least 18 years old and be comfortable in and around the water.

Logistics:

Work within your team will be undertaken using technology ie. Phone, email, webex with the occasional face to face meeting as necessary. You will be required to attend team lead meetings via conference call with the occasional face to face meeting as required.

Timeframe for Appointment:

This position will commence February 2010 and terminate July 31st , 2010.
